

# NB Military History Award

Celebrating Amateur Radio Across New Brunswick's Military Historical Sites

Presented by the Atlantic Canada DX & Contest Group



## 1. Spirit of the NB Military Historical Sites Award

The NB Military Historical Sites Award recognizes amateur radio operators who successfully make two-way contacts with activators operating from Military Historical Sites across New Brunswick.

The award encourages fellowship, promotes the beauty of New Brunswick's outdoors, and celebrates the role of amateur radio in connecting people.

This program complements other radiosport and award initiatives — it does not compete with them.

## 2. Qualifying Military Historical Sites

Any publicly accessible park located in New Brunswick may qualify, regardless of ownership (provincial, municipal, private, or community-managed).

Military Historical Sites must have a natural or outdoor focus. Facilities used primarily for sporting events without a nature component may not qualify.

## 3. Valid Contacts

A valid contact is any two-way exchange between a hunter and an activator operating from a qualifying NB military historical location.

All bands and modes are permitted.

## 4. Award Levels

Awards are issued to hunters based on the total number of successful QSOs with NB park activators:

- Award for 1 site contact
- Award for 5 site contacts
- Award for 10 site contacts
- Award for 25 site contacts
- Award for 50 site contacts
- Award for 100 site contacts

Each level represents a milestone of achievement and recognition within the NB Military Historical Sites Award program.

## 5. Logging & Submissions

Hunters must provide a log of their qualifying contacts.

Logs are submitted through the HamLog program and reviewed by a moderator.

There is no time limit for submissions, allowing operators to work toward higher award levels at their own pace.

## 6. Fellowship & Community

The NB Military Historical Sites Award is about more than numbers — building connections, encouraging participation, and sharing the history of New Brunswick's Military Historical Sites with the world.

Hunters are encouraged to support activators, celebrate achievements, and promote positive amateur radio practices.

## 7. Use of the NB Military Historical Sites Award Logo

The NB Military Historical Sites Award logo may be used freely on QSL cards, social media posts and profiles, YouTube videos, and event promotions.

There are no restrictions on its use for personal, non-commercial purposes.

The logo is a badge of pride for all participants in the program.
